Omega Mu Zeta Chapter's charter members would like to offer one graduating female senior of African descent, attending a four (4) year college/university, who meet academic and leadership criteria, a non-renewable \$1,000 academic scholarship. A few of the qualifying criteria are as follows: must reside and (or) attend school in our service area of Middlesex County and/or have a parent who is member of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Omega Mu Zeta Chapter, and/or be a member of Omega Mu Zeta Youth Auxiliary. You must have a minimum grade point average (GPA) of 3.0, and demonstrate leadership through extra-curricular activities and community service. All scholarship winners MUST attend the Zeta Youth Rocks Awards Ceremony on Saturday, *May 30, 2020*.

Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. is an international, historically black Greek-lettered sorority founded by five women at Howard University whose founding principles are scholarship, service, sisterhood, and finer womanhood. ZETA PHI BETA SORORITY, INC. OMEGA MU ZETA CHAPTER GUIDELINES FOR 2019 -2020 ACADEMIC YEAR ANY APPLICATION NOT MEETING THESE GUIDELINES WILL BE DISQUALIFIED

- 1. This scholarship is for an Afro American descent, graduating female senior attending a four (4) year college/university, attending a high school and/or reside in our service area of Middlesex County and/or the daughter of a Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. Omega Mu Zeta Chapter member and/or Omega Mu Zeta Youth Auxiliary member.
- 2. Only <u>completed applications</u> will be reviewed. If sections of the application are not applicable to you, please note it by answering "N/A."
- 3. Please include your complete permanent mailing address, phone number and email address (*if applicable*) on the application. Parents must provide permanent mailing information as well.
- 4. Current headshot photo, preferably graduation picture.
- 5. Submit **TWO** (2) letters of recommendation, one from a non-relative (friend, neighbor, minister, etc.) and another from a current or recent administrator or teacher. Letters must be current, dated, and include original signatures.
- Proof of Community Service and number of hours completed (includes certified documentation from community organization i.e. certified letter, certificate, or school transcript of service).
 You cannot just list your hours, we need official proof
- 7. Submit current transcript with official school stamp, embossed seal, or authorizing signature of school official. Transcript should include current GPA, Class Rank, and ACT/SAT score.
- 8. Submit current 2019-2020 semester/cycle grades.
- 9. **Proof of acceptance** to a four (4) year college/university.
- 10. Submit a graded essay of your choice for review from your current high school.
- 11. For High School Official Use Only Your guidance counselor/home school administrator must complete the section at the bottom of the application requesting GPA, rank, and SAT/ACT score information.

- 12. All recipients will be sent 1 additional **ticket to "Zeta Youth Rocks"** program on **Saturday, May** 30, 2020. Additional ticket (s) will cost \$30. You must attend the event in order to receive the scholarship. All scholarship winners who do not attend will forfeit their scholarship.
- 13. The application must be **completed and postmarked** to Ms. Denise Davis **no later than Monday**, March 16. 2020. All applications must contain all enclosures and be mailed in one packet only. Applications that are submitted late will not be considered.
