Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act Report

School District Grades for the South Amboy School District as determined by the State of New Jersey Department of Education under the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR) (P.L. 2010, c.122).

Under the Commissioner's Program, the school grade for ABR is a raw score of data and the sum of the ratings for all indicators within each core element on the School Self-Assessment (e.g., 65 of 78 points). The maximum total score for a school is 78 points. The school district's grade is an average of the total scores of all schools in the school district. The Department is not issuing any associated value or ranking for the raw and average scores. The raw and average scores reflect the school and school district's degree of compliance with the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act (ABR) as determined primarily through each school's self-assessment of its implementation of the ABR filed with the New Jersey Department of Education at the end of the 2015-2016 school year.

Throughout the implementation of the Anti-Bullying Bill of Rights Act, our district continues to further enhance our trainings, programs, and procedures relative to harassment, intimidation and bullying.
